


What are the **benefits** of community solar?

It's good for the planet.

When you support renewable solar energy within Oregon, you help reduce greenhouse gas emissions by making electricity cleaner for everybody. Your subscription helps create new projects that wouldn't exist otherwise.



It's minimal risk.

Income-qualified participants have no up-front costs or termination fees, and the program works well with utility discount programs and energy assistance.

It's accessible.

Community solar is a great option for renters and other customers who want to support renewable solar energy but may not have an ideal roof or capacity to invest in a rooftop

It's local.

You are investing in projects located within Oregon and in your utility territory, supporting clean energy jobs.



What is the Oregon Community Solar Program?

The Oregon Community Solar Program gives thousands of Oregonians new opportunities to go solar without needing to own a home, have a sunny roof, or purchase the panels yourself!


Community Solar allows many people to subscribe to a large off-site solar project and share the benefits by receiving a credit on their monthly utility bill. There is a subscription fee, but for income-qualified participants it will always be smaller than the credit- resulting in savings every month! Qualified low-income participants will save at least 10% annually on their electric bills.

Who can participate?

Most Oregon customers of Portland General Electric, Pacific Power and Idaho Power are eligible to participate in the Oregon Community Solar Program. Participants can be residents, businesses, nonprofits, or government entities. You can live in any kind of home, rent or own.



HOW COMMUNITY SOLAR WORKS



Income Qualifications

Low-income participants have additional protections to minimize risk and receive deeper benefits. You must be a qualifying utility customer and have a gross income at or below 80% state median income.
